

From the Priest in Charge Fr. Jere Hinson

Dear Friends in Christ,

"Peace be with you," our Lord said to his friends when he appeared to them after the Resurrection. And then he said it again: "Peace be with you." According to the account in John's gospel (20:19-23), they were afraid of Jerusalem's religious authorities. Their fear was akin to what many feel about the coming election, especially our vulnerability to events beyond our control. Our faith is that Jesus's two-fold promise is meant for us as well, even as Nov. 5 looms. And it surely is. Peace be with you. Peace be with you.

Peace is inherently relational. One is at peace with oneself and with others. There are inner and outer aspects of peace. Spiritual practices are hugely beneficial for helping with inner conflict. Taking time for prayer, for reading scriptures and devotional texts, to have conversations with trusted friends and mentors about deep things going on in our lives and inviting the Spirit's presence promotes healing, health, and hope. The outer aspects of peace often reflect our inner aspects. Mastery of one's own anxiety and being able to be present to people in conflict is at the heart of what Paul is talking about in 2 nd Corinthians, Chapter 5 where we are all called 'ambassadors of reconciliation.' Politics, at its noblest, is the art of reconciling differences without recourse to violence.

Peace is also something that doesn't 'just happen'. Jesus says in Matthew 5:9, "Blessed are the peacemakers." The Greek word for peacemakers is εἰρηνοποιοί (eirēnopoioi). It shows up only here in the whole Bible (although word for 'peace' shows up a lot more). Peace is something that needs to be created. It needs to be fashioned. Augustine says in the City of God that peace is the "order created by just, political, community and mediated through law." So, peace is not chaos, it's order. That order is dynamic, however, not static, as it must be constantly created by societies as they experience friction in understandings of what is just; will need to figure out processes that solve problems without violence; and form a culture that is both cohesive and expansive. None of this is easy! I suspect that is why Jesus followed up "Blessed are the peacemakers" with "for they shall be called children of God." A high calling, indeed!

Here at St. Paul's, we will do our part in shaping a community life that prays for, promotes and propagates peace. I will have the Church open for prayer from Noon to 6pm on Tuesday, 5 November. On the hour and half hour prayers will be offered. If you can't come in person, please take a moment during the day to pray for and practice peace and peacemaking. Here is a prayer I share from my friend the Right Reverend John Taylor, Bishop of Los Angeles,

Almighty and everlasting God, the sweep of human history discloses that only free, fair, and peaceful elections, and our civic covenant to abide by their outcomes, con contain your people's unruly temperaments, and competing needs, desires, and grievances. We pray for an orderly United States election. We pray that candidates will abide by the results and model acceptance for their followers. Best prepared by your grace for their next campaigns will be winners who resist triumphalism and losers who resolve to learn the right lessons from defeat. Above all, we pray for peace and for liberty and justice for all, and we abide in your promise that you will make all things work together for what is good and righteous for those with faith in your providence. We pray in the Risen One's name. Amen.



The program also provides an opportunity for daily contact with a staff member or a Meals on Wheels volunteer. From Rev. Ryan

Octoberr 20th marked the beginning of a new experiment—an intergenerational confirmation class. In all my time focusing on intergenerational ministry and its importance to the life of the church and longevity of faithful practice among young people, I have never had the marvelous opportunity to co-facilitate a group of people aged 11-74 as we learn together what it means to follow Jesus for a lifetime. As a facilitator, I was privileged to witness the most profound moments when small groups of people with vastly different life experiences and faith journeys sat around a table and shared what faith has meant to them and why they continue to pursue living a Christian life in a culture that tempts them to do otherwise. Questions were asked, doubts were shared, prayers were lifted, and God's Spirit was palpably in all of it, drawing us closer to the heart of God and deeper into community life with one another. It is a blessing to minister alongside this vibrant faith community willing to step outside the box and embrace a new way of experiencing God in our midst.
