

From the Priest in Charge Fr. Iere Hinson

Prayers and best wishes to you as we begin the month of February deep into the Epiphany season! What a January we had! Nine St. Paul's people were confirmed, received, or reaffirmed their faith during Bishop Cathleen's visit with us. In addition, she gave us her blessing on all that we are doing here which is growing our church while serving as a model of local implementation of the diocesan strategic plan. At our annual meeting we elected new members to the vestry and our church's foundation, celebrated those who have served faithfully over the past year, and gave thanks for the remarkable generosity that has created a balanced budget. I am so grateful to be able to focus on the pastoral, preaching, and teaching offices of priestcraft because your contributions to our team-effort. Someone once called me the Ted Lasso of priests, but that television show's depth came from the ensemble cast and crew. Indefatigable enthusiasm is what I bring—you all bring the rest!!

This month marks the kickoff for 'the next big thing' at St. Paul's—our generational opportunity to contribute the lasting legacy of the Episcopal Branch of the Jesus Movement here in Northeast Kansas/Northwest Missouri—which is the restoration of our historic organ. The great composer J.S. Bach, whose sacred music and fugues can move me to tears, once observed, "The aim and final end of all music should be none other than the glory of God and the refreshment of the soul." As you may know, Hook & Hastings, Boston, MA, built our organ in 1883. In the 1940s the Kilgen Organ Co., St. Louis, electrified the organ. With the exception of minor repairs in the 1990s, it hasn't been formally maintained since. Because of the anticipated expense, and higher priorities at the time, the Church deferred the necessary maintenance. I don't want to steal any of the thunder from our Organ Restoration Committee—come and engage with them on Sunday, 2 February, to learn more about the campaign and how our music contributes to transforming the lives of the saints here at St. Paul's! 




Grandparents at Prayer (G@P)

Help restore St. Paul's historic organ

Sing to the LORD a new song, for he has done marvelous things; his right hand and his holy arm have worked salvation for him. - Psalm 98:1 (New International Version)

Dear Friends,

St. Paul's Episcopal Church in Leavenworth, Kansas was built in 1864. Our organ was built and installed in 1883 by the Hooks & Hastings company of Weston, Massachusetts. For over 140 years our organ has helped us celebrate weekly services, baptisms, weddings, funerals, Christmas pageants, Easter celebrations, confirmations and Holy Days.

In the 1940s the organ was updated to use electricity, but that technology includes cloth-covered wires, which are a safety hazard. For the past 85 years, few improvements have been made beyond the occasional tuning. The organ's console's electro-pneumatic parts and preset buttons are worn out; many of the original features no longer work; and the blower does not produce enough wind for the pipes. Many of the pipes need tuning to enable them to reach their full potential.

Discussions were held over the past 30 years about whether to make repairs to the organ, but the expense was always in competition with higher priorities. With the recently completed renovations to the Parish House and the growth of our Church family, now is the time to act. We have a generational opportunity to make our contribution to the lasting legacy that is St. Paul's.

The Organ Restoration Campaign goal is to raise \$175,000 to make the needed repairs. We intend to contract with an organ repair company in January 2026. That gives us almost a year to raise the funds. In addition to the funds we raise, the Committee will apply for grants to help offset the cost.

The organ's music has been a critical part of our spiritual lives for almost a century and a half, and we need to ensure it is there, and fully operational, for us and for those who come after us.
