

From the Priest in Charge Fr. Iere Hinson

Grace and peace to the Episcopal Branch of the Jesus Movement in Northeast Kansas and Northwest Missouri! We are well into our Lenten journey during which we have focused on penitence and repentance, two very similar words. Both represent things that people who desire to live out of transcendent values must do constantly not just when we discover we've done something wrong. I harken back to my days aboard ship. We would constantly check the ship's PIM—Plan of Intended Movement—to see if we were on plan, off plan, or needed a new plan. Now a days we use constellations of satellites to fix our position. When I first started, however, we used radio beams, direction finders, compass, noon sights, and the stars. Once upon a time I was proficient in the use of a sextant! The spiritual life is similar. Do not wait until you find yourself in shoal water and hard aground! Use Lent and in particular Holy Week, to take a fix on your life. Are you incarnating the fruits of the Spirit? Is God's will making its way from Heaven into your earthly voyage? Join your fellow mariners in this adventure of a lifetime!

Speaking of fellow mariners, have you noticed that there are new members of St. Paul's crew around lately? Have you met Roger and Di, Rich and Rose, Camille, Lenny, Alex and Chase, Lora, Terry, or Sherry? Please wear your name tags and get to know these St. Paul's people who God's Spirit has called into fellowship in the past couple of months. As we live into the God's vision of the church in Acts Chapter 2 through our Generous Community, Gracious Welcome and Enduring Worship, God adds to our number daily. Thank you for your part in this glorious undertaking.

Many thanks as well to Beth Fitz Gibbon and the Organ Restoration team. Through your generosity and their diligence, we are making progress toward a generational goal that will ensure we are able to praise God through choral organ music for decades to come. I love our music—in case you missed it, the highlight of last week's worship was Marje Leser encouraging the three young acolytes to sing the closing hymn—it was as if she had her own youth choir!!

There are many places to plug into our common life. We have already existing programs you can learn about via our website or the booklet on Lay Ministries that can be found in the parish hall. Sunday school, Vacation Bible School, and our nursery are particular arenas that our Education Director, Jenn Turner (a magnificent volunteer), the Parish Life Committee and I are particularly highlighting over the next few months. If lay people feel called to lead an emerging ministry we are only limited by our imaginations.

On Wednesday April 2 nd our Lenten Supper will feature special guest Shelly Swartz, Jan Hubbard's niece. She will be talking with us about her work as an active learning facilitator and how it contributes to the spiritual growth of the participants. Join us starting at 5:30pm, we eat at 6:00pm and the talk starts at 6:30pm.

Finally beloved, in the midst of times of trial and tribulations, and you find your mind spinning, heed the words of our patron, St. Paul in Philippians 4:8 and focus on, "whatever is true, whatever is honorable, whatever is right, whatever is pure, whatever is lovely, whatever is admirable--if anything is excellent or praiseworthy--think on these things."

From the Sr. Warden:

This month the Vestry decided to investigate the larger than expected snow removal bills, discussed the possibility of a later First Wednesday event focusing on different outreach opportunities, and agreed to host the April 20 (Easter Sunday) coffee hour.
