

From the Priest in Charge Fr. Jere Hinson

To God's holy people in Northeast Kansas, Northwest Missouri, and elsewhere, the faithful in Christ Jesus: Grace and peace to you from God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ. I love the beginnings of Paul's letters. They are full of joyful hope and expectation. Much like our seasons of Advent and Christmas.

Before I move on to Advent however, a huge THANK YOU and shout out to **Candy Dials** who led our Stewardship Campaign this year. She arranged for our guest speakers, keeps track of all the pledges, and does so much follow-up and behind the scenes work. All that is so that I, your priest, have no idea who pledged what. That way there can be no doubt, I hope, in your mind that my fierce love for you is simply because you are in my pastoral charge and for no other reason. It's an administrative burden that Candy carried with grace and care.

Now, on to **Advent!** Advent is a time of preparation, of looking back to in order to look forward, and of acknowledging the shadows of life before the profound joy of the Feast of the Incarnation, which is Christmas, bursts upon us. For **Sunday worship** we will be using Rite I, the Elizabethan language liturgical option. It is a bit more penitential in tone. I will also be asking for five minutes of silence in the nave before the service. Please graciously help me with that. Contemplative silence for Advent can help set the scene for holiness of worship. For a special treat, I've invited Fr. Ray Hartjen to be our celebrant on the Second Sunday of Advent. Another special treat will be a harpist on Gaudete Sunday (the Third Sunday of Advent). Much gratitude to our organist, Dr. Mark Stotler for arranging for that! Please make sure you thank him and all the members of the choir as this is a particularly awesome time to remember those who contribute their musical talents to enriching our worship.

First Wednesday will feature the return of Canon Lisa Senuta who will teach on the presence of grief during the "most wonderful time of the year", titled Lament and Live Anyway. We will also hold three midweek Eucharists with healing on 11 December at noon and 6pm and 18 December at noon. At 6pm on 18 December we will join our friends at First Presbyterian Church for a Blue Christmas liturgy. I've also invited them to join us on First Wednesday, so, please make every effort to take advantage of these opportunities for fellowship and growth in faith.

Christmas Eve, at 6:30pm on 24 December, will feature the return of a Christmas Pageant thanks to Jennifer Turner and crew! Expect children and storytelling and singing and infectious joy to abound! Christmas Day and New Year's Day will feature Eucharists at 9:30am for the Faithful who want to celebrate the Feast of the Incarnation and the Feast of the Holy Name, respectively.

I am the luckiest priest on earth to be working with a congregation that embraces its call to embody Enduring Worship, Generous Community, and Gracious Welcome! May each and every one of you be surprised by a profound and deep sense of joy and wonder this Holy Day season!




